About the Position

The Erie Philharmonic seeks a dynamic, visionary, and entrepreneurial leader to continue the momentum of Erie's premiere arts organization. Our next executive director must be prepared to build on the foundation of a 110-year-old orchestra that has tripled its operating budget to \$3 million in less than a decade, performs to sold-out audiences in the historic Warner Theatre, maintained its visibility and relevance during the COVID-19 pandemic, and makes a \$10 million plus economic impact across Pennsylvania. The winning candidate will also drive a thriving 100-voice Erie Philharmonic Chorus and a robust youth music education program which includes the Erie Junior Philharmonic, and the Erie Philharmonic Junior Chorus, Youth Chorale, and Preparatory Choir.

We seek a creative leader who can collaborate, delegate, and inspire our talented and proven staff as they embrace the Erie Philharmonic mission: to strengthen our community and region by providing high quality live concerts and programs that enrich, entertain, and educate.

About the Erie Philharmonic

Founded in 1913, the Erie Philharmonic is one of the oldest continuous professional orchestras in the nation. The orchestra performs a full 10-concert season of symphonic and pops programs in the iconic Warner Theatre. The historic hall completed a \$27 million renovation in 2022 to enhance its acoustics, technology, stage, and artist and audience experience. Our patrons say the orchestra never sounded better. Our musicians agree and say they love performing to a full house in Erie. Music Director Daniel Meyer, first named to the post in 2007, is now the longest-tenured conductor in Erie Philharmonic history. Maestro Meyer has led the orchestra to new heights with more than 40 sold out performances, record subscription sales, world premieres, and far-reaching educational programming. The orchestra is a cultural asset, generating more than \$8.6 million annually in Erie County, and sustaining 141 jobs.
